### A CLEAN MANGER

Where no oxen are, the manger is clean, but much revenue comes by the

strength of the ox. - Proverbs 14:4

Oh, the pressure we feel to have our houses clean! It's nice to know that God is sensitive to this issue. This is a great proverb because it treats a tough topic in a humorous way. So many homeschool moms are frustrated because they can't get their houses clean enough. But this verse gently shows us the truth about children. There are very real blessings that come to us from the strength of our children. Even though they make a mess and need to be fed, they will reward us with so much more than the world predicts.

Today, I laughingly told my kids that sometimes I feel that our house resembles the Ringling Brothers Circus. We were sitting at our table having a writer's workshop and suddenly heard the familiar screech of the trash man's truck. GO! GO! GO! I said as I pointed around the table. Six children jumped up and raced for the trashcans. While the many hands made light work, I'm sure our swarming outside was a comical sight to the trash guys. "Whew! We got the trash out just in time!" was all that mattered to me.

Twenty minutes later, we were making lunch in the kitchen and the doorbell rang. Oh! No! It's the delivery guy with the new furniture for the bedroom. "Quick! Matthew," I said, move the extra mattress leaning against the hall wall and move the hall chest out of the way!" Elizabeth got the front door keys and said "Slowly now, Mom, open the door very slowly." And we slowly opened the door to get our new furniture. The boys helped the men bring it in from the truck and carried it up the stairs.

Yes, God agrees with us that if we had no children the hallway would stay perpetually clean. It wouldn't have an extra bed mattress in it and we wouldn't have to put out all that trash! Over three thousand years ago, He foresaw all our homeschooling messes and wrote us a note to cheer us up and help us see the real truth.

We need to bring this proverbial message to the rest of America. So many husbands and wives postpone having children because they are too costly and too messy. Like the proverbs says, if there are no children the "crib" is clean. But blessings lie in our choice to go ahead and have those children and trust that they will not run us into the poor house but bring us family ties that bind and

support us with added strength.

Here are just a few ideas that might help ease the burden and mess of living with and homeschooling our children.

- 1. Make part of your dinner in the morning. I hate making the salad, so every morning I make a salad, then wrap and refrigerate it. Making dinner is much less of a burden when some of it was made in the morning.
- Put in a load of wash at breakfast and lunch. During homeschool, give your child a school break and ask him to move the laundry to the dryer or fold the dry load and take it to the bedrooms.
- 3. Many hands make light work, so give lots of school breaks and ask children to do small jobs like; unload the dishwasher, make the salad, or feed the dog. Most kids are happy to take a mental break, get up and stretch their legs, and do something physical.
- 4. Spend less time cleaning and more time keeping your children occupied with you. Children will not be messing up the house if they are learning with you! Some moms just don't get it. They let the children play and play while they scrub and scrub only to get more and more behind. They don't realize that children are not messing up the house while mom is reading books to them.
- Limit house clean up periods to only certain times of the day, for example, once in the morning and once before dinner. Ignore the house during the rest of the day.

You will surely miss your children when they're grown. Don't just tolerate the messes that come with children, but embrace the messes as hints of a greater good. You and your children will not clearly remember the big birthdays you threw when they were small, but you will remember the everyday toys scattered all around the living floor. You will think back fondly to the days when you made block ramps and roads and endlessly raced the matchbox cards down them. And you'll remember with pride the wonderful feats of architecture your children accomplished with all those Legos. The annoyances of stepping on a Lego or hearing it crackling up your vacuum cleaner won't seem to have been all that important. This is the stuff memories are made of - all the rest will fade away.

### **Alabama Education Law Changes**

It's great to homeschool in Alabama! For over thirty years, Alabama has been a wonderful homeschooling state and since a new law passed in 2014, things are even better! SB 38, passed in March 2014, proclaims that "Nonpublic schools, including private, church, parochial, and religious schools, offering educational instruction in grades K-12, as well as home-schooled students, are not subject to licensure or regulation by the state or any political subdivision of the state, including the State Department of Education." Notice that this wording also separates home-schooled students from nonpublic schools, effectively recognizing homeschoolers as a separate entity.

As Dee Black, senior counsel for HSLDA points out, "With the enactment of Senate Bill 38 on April 2, 2014, Alabama law now expressly recognizes home instruction by someone other than a state-certified private tutor as an option for complying with the compulsory attendance requirements."

Parents who homeschool their own children are not the only ones who are interested in homeschooling. Many educators have longed for opportunities to practice their teaching arts without being encumbered by bureaucratic paperwork, whining parents and misbehaving students. These teachers see opportunities to assist homeschool families who are excited about learning. So, the doors are opening wider in Alabama and we can't wait to see how homeschooling will continue to grow in popularity both in the number of families who homeschool and in the number of businesses who provide services to facilitate and enhance homeschooling.
